HISTORY

United Churches Elizabethtown Area (UCEA) was founded in 1969 to meet the need for affordable and quality childcare. UCEA created the Elizabethtown Child Care Center, which grew into its own organization.

Throughout its history, UCEA supported community projects and organizations while exploring the potential for more impact. The Community Cupboard grew from a food bank to a choice food pantry. UCEA currently spearheads Etown Meals on Wheels, the Community Cupboard, the Clothing Barn and the Community Place on Washington campus.

After dreaming of a centralized location for services, UCEA purchased property on Washington Street in 2018 This campus of 4 buildings, known as Community Place on Washington (CPOW), houses the programs of UCEA and other community non-profit organizations.

Cupboard

Shopping Assistant

Escorts clients through the choice pantry, helping them to make selections of various foods and other items. Assist clients with loading grocery carts and placing the groceries into their vehicles.

Stockroom Attendant

Helps unload food donations, inspects product and moves it from the stockroom to the shelves and organizes the stockroom area.

Donation Pick-Up

Transport donated items from the Weis and Giant stores to the Community Cupboard on Wednesday and/or Saturday.

Garden Volunteer

Helps to plant, weed, water, and harvest the community garden.
